

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

The webinar was held on the topic of PG preparation, where in, esteemed guest speakers were asked to enlighten medical undergraduates about the nuances of preparing oneself to tackle the post graduate examination. The purpose of the webinar was to educate undergraduate medicos on the various techniques and tactics to crack Neet pg exam and to also rid them of their fears and doubts. The guest speakers were eminent doctors(Alumni) with postgraduation from reputed and esteemed medical universities. They volunteered to take time off their busy schedule to elaborate and share their personal experiences, the highs and lows, the difficulties they went through and the hard work they put in to ace the exams with flying colours. The event started at around 5 pm which was presided over by almost 67 attendees, all of them being from the final year, along with our esteemed dean Dr.Rajamuthiah, our medical superintendent Dr. Thirunavukkarasu sir, the HOD of physiology Dr. Anu ma'am and the members of the velammal alumni association. session started off with the welcome speech by Dr. Ramesh sir, which was followed by the introduction of the speakers which was done by Dr.Maria Vidhyan. Then, the Alumni speakers: Dr. Abishek, Dr. Aruna and Dr. Saran lal respectively, took turns to share their personalised experiences during the course of preparation for their PG exam. It gave the attendees an insight into their strategies, tactics, references, and a lot more ideas which laid a foundation as to what the possibilities are and what we can make of them. # The S-P-I-K-E-S Protocol

- S Setting Up the Conversation
- P Perception
- Invitation
- K Knowledge
- **E** Emotions
- S Strategy and Summary

# S – SETTING - Secure an appropriate area for the discussion.

- Have the conversation in a guiet undisturbed area.
- Prepare for what to say and anticipate the patient/family reaction.
- Have the key people (whom the patient wants) in the room.
- Seat the patient closest to you and have no barriers between you.
- Sit down, try to be calm, make eye contact.

# P – PERCEPTION - Assess the patient's understanding of the seriousness of their condition.

- Ask what the patient and family already know.
  - "Tell me what you understand about your condition so far."
  - "What did the other doctors tell you?"
  - "I'd like to be sure we are on the same page with understanding your condition, so can you tell me..."
- Assess the patient and family members' level of understanding.
- Take note of discrepancies in the patient's understanding and what is actually true.
- Watch for signs of denial.

# | – INVITATION - Get permission to have the discussion. "ASK BEFORE YOU TELL."

- Set goals for the discussion ask the patient if they want to know the details of the medical condition/treatment.
   "I'd like to go over the results, would that be ok?"
   "Today my plan is to discuss...is that okay?"
- Accept the patient's right not to know.
- Offer to answer any questions the patient/family member may have.

# K – KNOWLEDGE - Explaining the facts

- Avoid medical jargon by explaining the facts in a manner that the patient will understand.
   NOT: "You have a nuclear grade 1ER/PR positive spiculated 4-centimeter lesion."
   BETTER: "You have a fairly good sized tumor in your breast."
- Fill in any gaps that were evident in the "Perception" stage.
- Present the information in small chunks.
- After each chunk, verify the patient's understanding.
   "Are you with me so far?"

# E – EMOTIONS - The Empathic Response – Be Supportive

- Deal with emotions as they occur (patients who are very emotional will not comprehend what you say).
- Use open-ended and direct questions to explore what the patient is feeling.

```
"Can you tell me more about how you feel?"
"Did that make you angry?"
```

Respond to emotions with empathic and affirming statements.

```
"I can see you weren't expecting this."

"Most people would be upset finding this out."
```

- Use "tell me more" statements.
   PT: "I don't know how I'm going to tell my kids."
   MD: "Tell me more about that."
- Try to keep your own emotions from taking over.
- AVOID responding with false reassurance such as:

```
"Everything will be fine."
"I've seen lots of miracles happen."
```

Note: You don't have to have the same feelings as the patient nor do you have to agree with the patient.

# S - STRATEGY & SUMMARY - Closing the interview

#### Strategy

- Decide what the best medical plan would be for the patient.
- Appraise in your mind or clarify with the patient their expectations of treatment and outcome.
- Recommend a strategy on how to proceed.
- Collaborate and agree on the plan.
- Ask the patient to repeat to you their understanding of the plan.
- Have a clear treatment plan in writing for the patient to take home with them.

#### Summary

- Summarize the conversation.
- Offer to answer questions. (be prepared for tough questions):

PT: "Does this mean I'm going to die?"

MD: "Tell me more about what concerns you?"

PT: "Can I be cured?"

MD: "I'm sorry to say that it is unlikely. Our goal is to keep it in check."

PT: "How long do I have to live?"

MD: "I can discuss that with you, but first tell me why you ask?"

# The C-L-A-S-S Protocol

Five Key Steps for Clinical Interviews

C - CONTEXT	The physical set up of the area you choose for the interview
L - LISTENING SKILLS	How to be an effective listener
A – ACKNOWLEDGE	How to validate, explore and address emotions and concerns
S - STRATEGY	How to provide a management plan that the patient can understand
S - SUMMARY	How to summarize and clarify the conversation ensuring comprehension

# C-Context (setting)

#### A private area with no distractions

#### **Physical Space**

- Choose an area where you can have a private conversation.
- Your eyes should be at the same level as the patient and/or family member (sit down if you need to).
- There should be no physical barriers between you.
- If you are behind a desk, have the patient and/or family members sit across the corner.
- Have a box of tissues available.

#### Family Members/Friends

The patient should be seated closest to you.

#### **Body Language**

- Present a relaxed demeanor.
- Maintain eye contact except when the patient becomes upset.

#### Touch

- Only touch a non-threatening area (hand or forearm).
- Be aware of cultural issues that may not allow touching.

## L - LISTENING SKILLS

Be an effective listener.

#### **Open Ended Questions**

- · "How did you manage with the new treatment?"
- "Can you tell me more about your concerns?"
- · "How have you been feeling?"

#### **Facilitating**

- Allow the patient to speak without interrupting them.
- Nod to let the patient know you are following them.
- Repeat a key word from the patient's last sentence in your first sentence.

### Clarifying

- · "So, if I understand you correctly, you are saying..."
- · "Tell me more about that."

## Time & Interruptions

- If there are time constraints, let the patient know ahead of time.
- Pagers and phone calls don't answer, but if you must, apologize to the patient before answering.
- Try to prepare the patient if you know you will be interrupted.

## A -ACKNOWLEDGE EMOTIONS

Explore, identify, and respond to the emotion.

#### The Empathic Response

- Identify the emotion.
- Identify the cause of the emotion.
- Respond by showing you have made the connection between the emotion and the cause.
  - "That must have felt terrible when..."
  - "Most people would be upset about this."
- You don't have to have the same feelings as the patient.
- You don't have to agree with the patient's feelings.

## S -STRATEGY

Propose a plan that the patient will understand

#### The Plan

- Appraise in your mind or clarify with the patient their expectations of treatment and outcome.
- Decide what the best medical plan would be for the patient.
- Recommend a strategy on how to proceed.
- Evaluate the patient's response.
- Collaborate and agree on the plan.

# S-SUMMARY

# Closing the interview

### **Final Thoughts**

- Summarize the discussion in a clear and concise manner.
- Check the patient's understanding.
- Ask if the patient has any other questions for you.
- If you don't have time for further questions, suggest that they can be addressed at the next appointment.
- Make a clear contract for a follow up visit.

# The C-O-N-E-S Protocol

## The C-O-N-E-S Protocol

When You Have to Tell

- **C** Context
- Opening Shot
- N Narrative
- **E** Emotions
- Strategy & Summary

#### Use the C-O-N-E-S Protocol when:

- Disclosing that a medical error has occurred
- There is a sudden deterioration in the patient's medical condition
- Talking to the family about a sudden death

NOTE: The news should be delivered by the most senior person on the patient's treatment team.

## C - Context

- Prepare for what to say and anticipate the patient/family reaction.
- Have the conversation in a quiet undisturbed area.
- Seat the patient closest to you and have no barriers between you.
- Sit down, try to be calm, maintain eye contact.
- Have a box of tissues available.

## O – Opening Shot

Alert the patient/family member of important news.

"This is difficult. I have to tell you what I found out about why your mother is so ill."

"This is hard, but I have some information to give you that is important."

"I must talk to you about your condition."

"Thanks for coming in. I must tell you what is going on with your father."

## N - Narrative Approach

Explain the chronological sequence of events.

```
"As you know, your mother came in back in..."

"Then, we gave her... and there was little improvement."

"Last night we....and I just found out that ..."
```

"In other words, she received too much chemotherapy."

- Avoid assigning blame and/or making excuses.
- Emphasize that you are investigating how the error occurred.

"We started investigations and by the end of today I hope to be able to answer your questions as clearly as possible."

"I hope by the end of today she will turn the corner and start improving."

Offer a clear apology.

"I am really sorry that this has happened."

## E - Emotions

- Address strong emotions with empathic responses.
- Use the E-V-E protocol as soon as strong emotion occurs.

"I know it's upsetting for you and it's awful for me too."

"I know this is awful."

"It's very rare, but it does happen and I'm sorry to say that it did."

- Beware of being pushed into making promises you can't deliver.
- Avoid reassuring the person that there's going to be a good outcome or that no harm was done.

## S – Strategy & Summary

- Summarize the discussion and make specific plans for follow up.
- Let them know the situation is a priority.

"I am the doctor responsible for your mother so it is important that I found out what happened."

"I'll be open and honest with you when I have all the facts."

"I can guarantee we will do our best."

"Here is what I propose we do."

"Let's meet at the end of today or I can call you when I know more."

- If you don't know the answer, say so and that you will attempt to find out.
- Disclosing medical errors is now a standard. It's not optional.
- Sensitive disclosures have a favorable impact on malpractice claims.



The online program concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Samir Bele, HoD Community medicine department, Velammal Medical College Hospital & Research Institute.

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


How to communicate with your patient effectively? - an activity by the alumni of Velammal medical college.

# Why teach communication skills?

## Today's scenario

- Complex illnesses and treatments
- Healthcare teams
- Increased patient expectations
- Blame and Complaint culture
- Litigation
- Diversity
- Resource limitation

## Whitintenant to study the meitical tinterviskills?

- To achieve an effective interview, doctors need to be able to integrate four aspects of their work which together determine their overall clinical competence:
- knowledge
- communication skills
- problem solving
- physical examination

# Are there problems in communication between doctors and patients?

• Video 1

# Are there problems in communication between doctors and nations?

54% of patients' complaints and 45% of their concerns are not elicited (Stewart et al. 1979).

In 50% of visits, the patient and the doctor do not agree on the nature of the main presenting problem (Starfield et al. 1981).

Only a minority of health professionals identify more than 60% of their patients' main concerns (Maguire et al. 1996).

# Are there problems in communication between doctors and patients?

- Consultations with problem outcomes are frequently characterized by unvoiced patient agenda items (Barry et al. 2000).
- Doctors frequently interrupt patients so soon after they begin their opening statement that patients fail to disclose significant concerns (Beckman and Frankel 1984; Marvel et al. 1999).
- Doctors often interrupt patients after the initial concern has been voiced apparently assuming that the first complaint is the chief one

# Gathering information

- Doctors often pursue a 'doctor-centred', closed approach to information gathering that discourages patients from telling their story or voicing their concerns
- Doctors rarely ask their patients to volunteer their ideas
- Doctors only respond positively to patient cues in 38% of cases in surgery and 21% of cases in primary care

# Explanation and planning

Doctors overestimate the time they devote to explanation and planning

Patients and doctors disagree over the relative importance of imparting different types of medical information

Doctors consistently use jargon that patients do not understand

There are significant problems with patients' recall and understanding of the information that doctors impart

Only a minority of patients achieve their preferred level of control in decision making

## Problems in communication

- Breakdown in communication between patients and physicians is a critical factor leading to malpractice litigation and violence against doctor
- Major concerns are deserting the patient, devaluing the patient's views, delivering information poorly and failing to understand the patient's perspective

# Lack of empathy and understanding

Doctors'lack of understanding of the patient as a person with individual concerns and wishes

Is there evidence that communication skills can overcome these problems and make a difference to patients, doctors and outcomes of care?



# Process of the interview

- The longer the doctor waits before interrupting the more likely they are to discover the full spread of issues
- The use of open rather than closed questions and the use of attentive listening lead to greater disclosure of patients' significant concerns
- The more questions that patients are allowed to ask of the doctor, the more information they obtain
- Picking up and responding to patient cues shortens rather than lengthens visits

### Patient satisfaction

- Greater 'patient-centredness' in the interview leads to greater patient satisfaction
- Discovering and acknowledging patients' expectations improves patient satisfaction
- Asking patients if they have any questions
- Physician non-verbal communication (eye contact, posture, nods, distance, communication of emotion through face and voice) is positively related to patient satisfaction
- Patient satisfaction is directly related to the amount of information that patients perceive they have been given by their doctors

# Patient recall and understanding

- Asking patients to repeat in their own words
- The patient's and doctor's explanatory frameworks are should not be at odds
- Patient recall is increased by, summarising, repetition, clarity and use of diagrams

# Adherence

- Patients who are viewed as partners, informed of treatment rationales and helped to understand their disease are more adherent to plans made (Schulman1979).
- Doctors can increase adherence to treatment regimens by explicitly asking patients about their knowledge, beliefs, concerns and attitudes to their own illness (Inui et al. 1976; Maiman et al. 1988).

## Outcome

- Patient-centred communication is associated with better recovery from discomfort and concern, better emotional health and fewer diagnostic tests and referrals
- Patients who are coached in asking questions and negotiating with their doctor not only obtain more information but actually achieve better blood pressure control in hypertension and improved blood sugar control in diabetes
- Improving communication with patients and their families significantly reduced length of stay

# Medico-legal issues

Reduced malpractice rates were seen in physicians who oriented their patients (signposted), asked for patients' opinions, checked for understanding, encouraged patients to talk, laughed and used humour (Levinson et al. 1997).

In a study of 103 orthopaedic surgeons, those who had better rapport with their patients, who took more time to explain and who were available had fewer malpractice suits (Adamson et al. 2000).


Can you teach and learn communication skills?

# teaching

Communication is a core clinical skill.

Specific learning methods are required to obtain behaviour change:

Changes resulting from communication skills training can be retained.



It is a series of learned skills.

Experience can be a poor teacher of communication skills.

Communication can be taught.

# Good Communication Skills are central to Clinical Medicine!

Diagnosis from History alone: 85%

Diagnosis after Examination only: 5-10%

Diagnosis after Investigation: 5-10%

# Example

#### **Clinical Skills**

- Give intramuscular and subcutaneous injections.
- Carry out arterial blood sampling.
- Perform suturing.

#### **Communication Skills**

- Explain procedure
- Respond to patient's emotions

# It is a series of learned skills

- Not just a matter of personality
- We need to identify the actual skills that have been used, practice the individual components and then put them back together again into a seamless whole

# Experience can be a poor teacher

- Unfortunately, communication skills do not necessarily improve with time
- While experience may be an excellent reinforcer of habits, it tends not to discern between good and bad habits, doctors persistently use the same methods over and over again
- Heifer (1970) showed that medical students' communication skills deteriorated as they proceeded through their training

Specific communication skills teaching does produce change in learners' skills: communication skills can be taught

- Aspergren's literature review quality-graded 180 studies on teaching and learning communication skills in medicine concluded that there is overwhelming support for the assertion that communication can be taught and learned
- More efficient and effective

# The changes resulting from communication skills training can be retained


• Maguire et al. (1986a) followed up their original students 5 years after their training. They found that both groups had improved but those who had been given communication skills training had maintained their superiority in key skills such as the use of open questions, clarification, picking up verbal cues and coverage of psychosocial issues

#### Specific learning methods are required to obtain change

systematic delineation and definition of essential skills

active small group or one-toone learning

repeated practice and rehearsal of skills




observation of learners

well-intentioned, detailed and descriptive feedback

video or audio recording and review Is the prize on offer to doctors and their patients worth the effort?

- Communication is not just 'being nice' but produces a more effective consultation for both patient and doctor.
- Effective communication significantly improves:
  - accuracy, efficiency and supportiveness
  - health outcomes for patients
  - satisfaction for both patient and doctor
  - the therapeutic relationship.
- Communication bridges the gap between evidence-based medicine and working with individual patients.

# Patients preferred those who

- Introduced themselves
- Were Empathetic
- Appeared self-confident
- Listened to them
- Responded to verbal cues
- Asked precise and simple questions
- Did not repeat themselves

# What I am going to do?

- Initiation of the interview (introduces self to patient, Uses name of patient in greeting, presents in a positive and attentive manner, defines the purpose of the interview).
- Listening Skills (maintains good eye contact, is attentive to patient's agenda, avoids distracting activities).
- Questioning Skills (speaks clearly and fluently, uses language understandable to patient, asks appropriate probing questions).
- Management Style and contents (does not make incorrect statements, give appropriately appropriate instructions in a readily understood manner, controls the direction and pace of the interview).
- Closing of Interview (summarizes what has been said, checks out problem list with the patient, reassures the patient appropriately, checks if there are any patient questions).

Date and time: 08th October 2022, 10:00 AM- 11:00 AM




