Date: 07.8.18

Venue: Lecture hall 2

The Department of Microbiology at Velammal Medical College Hospital & Research Institute conducted a seminar on "Biomedical Waste Management" on 7th August 2018. The event was held in Lecture Hall 2 with the aim of raising awareness about the proper management of biomedical waste and its significance in maintaining a safe and hygienic environment in healthcare facilities. A total of 98 delegates comprising medical students and staff from nursing department attended the programme.

The seminar commenced with an inauguration ceremony at 9.00 am, followed by a pre-test from 9.15 to 9.30 am. The pre-test was designed to assess the participants' existing knowledge on biomedical waste management, providing a baseline for evaluating the effectiveness of the seminar.

Dr. Kavitha - Patent filing process in India.







A workshop on Effective Medical Writing and Publishing

Report

Date: 5.12.2018

The second workshop on effective medical writing and publishing for the year 2018 was held on 5.12.2018. The aim of the workshop was to equip medical professionals with the skills and knowledge required to write and publish effective research papers in medical journals. The workshop was attended by 44 members of the teaching faculty.

The workshop was divided into three sessions. The first session focused on the basics of medical writing, including the structure and format of a research paper. Dr Samir Bele, Professor & Head, Department of Community Medicine, discussed the various sections of a research paper, including the abstract, introduction, methodology, results, and discussion. He also provided tips on how to write clear and concise sentences, avoid common grammar and punctuation errors, and use appropriate medical terminology.

The second session focused on the process of manuscript submission and publication. Dr Trupti Bodhare discussed the various types of medical journals, the submission guidelines for each journal, and the peer review process. Dr Trupti also provided tips on how to choose the right journal for a research paper, how to write an effective cover letter, and how to respond to reviewer comments.

The final session focused on the ethical considerations of medical writing and publishing. Dr Raj Kishore, member secretary of IEC, discussed the various ethical issues that can arise during the research and publication process, including plagiarism, data fabrication, and conflicts of interest. He also talked about how to avoid these ethical issues and how to ensure that research papers are conducted and reported ethically.

Throughout the workshop, the attendees were encouraged to participate in group discussions and ask questions. The resource persons also provided several exercises and writing prompts to help attendees practice their writing skills.

Anbumalar, Professor of Mechanical Engineering, Velammal College of Engineering and Technology, Madurai, began the session by providing an overview of IPR and the different types of IPRs. She explained the significance of IPR and its role in the growth of the economy. In the second session, Dr. V. At 1.30 pm, a post-test and quiz were conducted to evaluate the participants' knowledge retention and understanding of the topics covered during the program.






